It spends a whopping 28 months in small French oak but the wine does not taste unnecessarily oak driven.

There is quite a bit of oak flavour here, mind. It's citrusy and cedary and toasty too, but the juicy, blackberried underpinning is substantial enough to support it. Overall you'd call it a balanced wine. The first signs of leathery development are just starting to show - it's arguably been released at the perfect time.
